
Dear Nicasio Families,

Nicasio School Board Establishes Application Period for Interdistrict Transfer Requests into Nicasio School District for 2024-25


Beginning February 1, 2024 requests from non-resident students for interdistrict transfer (IDT) for the 2024-25 school year may be submitted to Nicasio School District. IDT Requests will be processed in accordance with school board policy and administrative regulations (BP/AR 5117). Requests received on or before May 5, 2024, will be considered by the Board of Trustees at the regular meeting held in June, 2024.

IDT requests from non-resident students received after May 5, 2024 will be processed and considered at a subsequent Board meeting.

As provided by Education Code section 46600.2(a)(5)(B), notice of the Governing Board's decision on IDT requests for the 2023-24 school year will be given as soon as possible, but no later than 14 calendar days after the commencement of instruction.





Parent comments regarding school climate and school-to-home communications (9)

Comments included positive feedback about the overall climate at Nicasio School, including a focus on academics as well as encouraging students to work well together. School and teacher newsletters were applauded as being informative and timely. Comments about communication included increasing regular communication about how a child is progressing in his/her learning between report cards, including how parents can support. Also, one respondent requested a comment period regarding the annual calendar.

Parent comments, questions or ideas regarding the new universal meals program (6)

Comments were very positive, especially in comparison with previous lunch offerings. Several comments expressed gratitude. One respondent requested less sugar and less fat in meals.

Parent comments regarding Nicasio School Foundation and Parent Club (2)

Comments included gratitude to those in leadership roles and the desire for more parents to join.

Parent comments regarding school facilities (2)

Comments included a positive rating of facilities and a suggestion to purchase a generator for use during power outages to maintain a regular school schedule.

Final parent comments (6)

Comments included gratitude to staff as well as a suggestion for increased training in restorative practices and a request for the return of Spanish as a specialist offering.
