Dear Parents/Guardians of Marin County Students:

We are writing about an issue that directly impacts the health and safety of our children - gun safety and the prevention of gun-related injuries. According to the Brady Campaign, it is estimated that 4.6 million children live in homes with access to unlocked guns. In addition, in 2018, the Wall Street Journal reported that 75% of guns used in school shootings came from the home. American gun violence continues to be a national health crisis.

Parents and guardians are legally responsible for protecting children by adhering to the guidelines for safe storage of firearms under California Law AB 231, which makes someone criminally liable if they store a loaded firearm where a child is likely to gain access to it.


Marin school and law enforcement agencies are working together to keep our children and our schools as safe as possible. We are pleased to share this information to help educate our families about gun safety. We want to raise awareness and stop tragedies before they happen by following the guidelines below:


- **Store guns safely** (locked in a safe and not loaded);
- **Ask** about the presence of unsecured guns in other homes (play dates, neighbors); and
- **Recognize** the risk factors and warning signs of suicide and depression and speak up.


The Marin County Office of Education Gun Safety webpage provides guidelines and resources on gun safety in the home. Information includes:

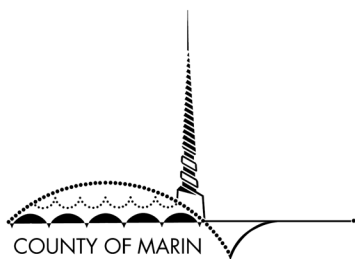
- Gun lock and gun safety resources - Marin County District Attorney Gun Locks and Marin County Sheriff's Office (415) 473-7265.
- Asking Saves Lives – Brady Campaign program helping parents ask questions about gun safety in the homes their children visit.
- Everytown / Moms Demand Action / Be Smart for Kids - Resources, tools and programs helping gun owners with safe gun storage and ownership practices.
- Gun Violence Restraining Order (GVRO) - Information about laws and the process that allowing families and friends to temporarily remove a firearm from a family member in crisis.

Together we can make sure our schools and communities are violence-free. If you have a firearm, thank you for ensuring that it is safely and securely stored.

Dear Administrators, Teachers, Staff, and Parents:

This letter is to provide an update on the novel coronavirus outbreak currently centered in China, and local measures to protect our community. Marin County Public Health continues to work closely with the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to limit risk to local residents. There are now six confirmed cases in California, and no persons under investigation for possible coronavirus illness in Marin County.

The CDC and Marin County Public Health recommend that any adult or child traveling from mainland China should be excluded from school for 14 days after they left China. Persons who have arrived from China prior to February 3, 2020 are at lower risk and do not need to be excluded.

Travelers returning from China are being advised to avoid public activities and gatherings, and self-monitor at home by remaining alert for fever, cough, or difficulty breathing. If someone develops these symptoms, they should contact their healthcare provider immediately by phone, prior to traveling to a healthcare facility. Public Health will be assisting in home monitoring individuals who are at risk for coronavirus.

Schools are advised to work with students who are under home monitoring to arrange supports, to help keep them up to date with their lessons.

The risk of spread of coronavirus locally remains very low. Importantly, influenza continues to circulate in Marin. Students, parents, staff and visitors should take every-day precautions to prevent the spread of infections including the common cold and flu.

- Encourage students and staff to stay home when they are sick.
 - Those who have a fever at school should go home and stay home until fever-free for at least 24 hours.
 - Separate sick students and staff from others until they can be picked up to go home.
- Promote hand hygiene among students and staff through education, scheduled time for handwashing, and availability of soap and water and/or hand sanitizer.
- Avoid touching your face, particularly your eyes, nose, and mouth.
- Teach and encourage proper cough etiquette—cough or sneeze into a tissue, sleeve, or arm (do not use hands).

- Perform routine surface cleaning.

We understand that this is a rapidly evolving situation that can cause worry and concern. We will continue monitor the situation and share information with our school community as it becomes available. Please do not hesitate to call the Public Health Office with any questions or concerns.

Kindergarten Registration – Fall 2020

Nicasio School District is announcing kindergarten registration for the 2020-21 school year. Children eligible for registration must be **5 years old on or before September 1, 2020** and reside within the boundaries of the Nicasio School District.

Transitional kindergarten for the 2020-21 academic year is available to children residing within Nicasio School District boundaries who will turn **5 years of age on or between September 2, 2020 and December 2, 2020**. Transitional kindergarten is a two-year program. Upon completion of the two-year transitional kindergarten program, students are promoted to first grade.

Nicasio School Board Establishes Application Period and Enrollment Capacity for Interdistrict Transfer Requests into Nicasio School District for 2020-21

Beginning February 3, 2020, requests from non-resident students for interdistrict transfer (IDT) for the 2020-21 school year may be submitted to Nicasio School District. IDT Requests will be processed in accordance with school board policy and administrative regulations (BP/AR 5117). Requests received on or before May 1, 2020, will be considered by the Board of Trustees at the regular meeting held in June, 2020.

IDT requests from non-resident students received after May 1, 2020 will be processed and considered at a subsequent Board meeting.

As provided by Education Code section 46600.2(a)(5)(B), notice of the Governing Board's decision on IDT requests for the 2020-21 school year will be given as soon as possible, but no later than 14 calendar days after the commencement of instruction.

Las solicitudes IDT de estudiantes no residentes recibidas después del 1 de mayo, 2020 serán procesadas y consideradas en una reunión posterior de la Mesa Directiva.

De acuerdo al Código de Educación sección 46600.2(a)(5)(B), la notificación de la decisión de la Mesa de Gobierno de las solicitudes IDT para el ciclo escolar 2020-21 se dará tan pronto como sea posible, y hasta 14 días calendario después del inicio de instrucción.
